Concepts to review: noun cases, adjective-noun agreement, demonstratives and intensifiers

Titus est fīlius Marcī. Marcus est pater Titī. Titus quoque<sup>1</sup> frāter Marciae est. Itaque<sup>2</sup> Marcia est soror Titī. Livia est uxor Marcī, et Marcus maritus Liviae est. Titus et Marcia sunt liberī<sup>3</sup> Marcī et Liviae. Marcus et Livia parentēs Titī et Marciae sunt. Ille puer fortis et pulcher est, et haec puella fortis et sapiēns est. Parentēs ipsī bonī et laetī sunt.

1. Draw a box around each of the common (i.e., non-capitalized) nouns.
2. Draw a circle around each of the adjectives (any kind, including demonstratives, intensives, and possessives).
3. Underline each of the verbs.
4. In this family, what is the name of the mother?
5. What is the name of the daughter?
6. In **Itaque Marcia est soror Titī** (line 2), which word is the predicate nominative?
7. What case are **Marcī** and **Liviae** in line 3?
8. What type of adjective is **fortis**: 2-1-2, 3-termination, 2-termination, or 1-termination?
